Job Purpose

Planning individual curricula for each pupil, incorporating relevant and stimulating learning activities and targets for them to work towards. Supporting the School Team to evaluate performance, development and inspire both colleagues and pupils.

Main Responsibilities

- Carry out initial assessment of new pupils
- Plan individual curricula for each pupil
- Prepare schemes of work and lesson plans for each designated pupil
- Prepare stimulating learning activities and resources, including ICT based activities
- Setting stretching targets related to pupils' SEN statement and other curriculum areas
- Deliver classes and individual sessions to pupils of different ages and abilities
- Assess work and provide feedback
- Monitor and record pupil progress
- Research new topic areas, maintaining up-to-date subject knowledge, and devising and writing new curriculum materials
- Submit student work to appropriate awarding bodies
- Comply with quality assurance procedures of awarding bodies
- Prepare reports for and attending statutory annual reviews or other related meetings, such as Looked After Child (LAC) reviews, Statement reviews and Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan reviews



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- Work in accordance with Our Place Schools' teaching and learning policies
- Supervise and support the work of teaching assistants and support workers in school
- Working in close collaboration with Our Place Schools' education and residential staff to ensure a consistent and holistic 24 hour provision for each young person
- Participate in and organise extracurricular activities, such as outings and social activities
- Undergoing regular lesson observations and participating in required in-service training (INSET) as part of continuing professional development (CPD)
- Attending all education team meetings
- Preparing risk assessments and completing regulatory paper work such as incident reports and accident forms
- Any other duties in relation to the education provision of Our Place Schools
